## **Purpose:**

To define when and how a fire investigator should be called

## Guideline:

A State Police Fire Investigator shall be notified of:

- 1. Any situation where the incident commander cannot confidently determine the cause and origin of the incident or has concerns about the incident and would like to consult with a State Police Fire Investigator.
- 2. Any intentionally set (incendiary) fire resulting in fatality, injury, loss of or damage to property, regardless of size or amount of damage.

In the following circumstances, both a Fire Investigator and local law enforcement personnel should be notified:

- 1. Vehicle fires involving suspicious circumstances:
  - A. Abandoned vehicles, missing license plates or VIN, time of day and unusual location
  - B. Fires in vehicles being operated at the time of the incident are most likely accidental.
- 2. Incidents involving juvenile suspects regardless of the amount of damage.
- 3. Any injuries, firefighter or civilian, resulting from direct flame contact, fireworks, or an assault (burn purposely inflicted by another person) that requires EMS intervention or transport.
- 4. Found incendiary, Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) or chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and explosive (CBRNE) devices.

## **Procedure:**

- 1. Notify the appropriate dispatch center of your request for a State Police Fire Investigator and/or local law enforcement.
- 2. Dispatch will make the notification.
- 3. An appropriate representative will either make contact via phone or respond to the scene.
- 4. If the State Police Fire Investigator and/or local law enforcement state they will respond to the scene, the incident commander or their designee shall remain on scene for no more than a reasonable time unless engaged in any continuing activity to control or extinguish the fire, or prevent re-igntion.

Any of the above scenes located in Augusta County should have the on-call duty officer notified and work with them for notifications of State Police Fire investigator and/or local law enforcement.
