Purpose:

The purpose of this SOG is to establish universal decorum.

Policy:

When Wintergreen Fire and/or Wintergreen Rescue receive a call, the following terminology will be used.

Rescue Squad Volunteers should use the following prefixes then their assigned radio number. The following prefixes will only be used when responding using a private vehicle.

Walkie - A volunteer with no training.

Driver – A volunteer trained in EVOC and released to drive.

Rescue – A volunteer trained at the EMT level and released to practice.

Trauma - A volunteer trained to the Advanced EMT level and released to practice.

Medic - A volunteer trained to the Intermediate/Paramedic level and released to practice.

Fire Department Volunteers should use the following prefixes. The following prefixes will only be used when responding using a private vehicle.

2600 #'s – A member of the Fire Department. Contact the Deputy Chief for member numbers.

Example: 2643 to Dispatch

The following prefixes will only be used when marking a piece of apparatus responding. Use the prefix then the assigned apparatus number.

If the apparatus is a transport unit, state level as below, then "unit #" to alert dispatch that this apparatus is a transport vehicle, then the apparatus number. This does not apply to response vehicles. Refer to SOG COM 04-001, Radio Procedures for information on how to properly respond.

Example: Wintergreen or Nelson Dispatch, Medic 177 responding to Ski Patrol.

Rescue – EMT level crew

Trauma – Advanced EMT level crew

Medic - Intermediate/Paramedic level crew

Squad - Truck carrying tactical and technical equipment

Response – A non-transport quick response vehicle

Engine – Truck carrying water and equipment used for fire fighting

Attack – Truck carrying water designed for initial structural attack or woods fire

Tanker – Truck carrying greater than 1500 gallons of water and able to transfer water with a low capacity pump.

Truck – Aerial platform with full engine capabilities, salvage supplies, tools, and equipment.

Career personnel will use the following prefix when needing to be identified on the radio.

Chief 61 – Chief of Fire and Rescue

Chief 62 – Deputy Chief

Career personnel will use the following number series:

Captain 61 - 63: Supervises daily operations

Captain 64: Administrative Captain

Captain 65 : Training Captain

Lieutenant 61 - 63: Supervises daily operations in the absence of the Captain

Lieutenant 91 - 93: Supervises daily operations of the NEMS crew

2600 series #'s: Firefighter/ALS/BLS Career personnel/Volunteers/Part-Time Firefighter/ALS/BLS Career personnel

2900 series #'s: NEMS Career Personnel
